February 2014 Police Incidents

Incidents Received: An officer was dispatched to a burglar alarm at Northwest Saving Bank. Upon arrival, police located a female custodian inside the building. The bank managers were contacted and it was secured. Police were called to YEMS for a fight between two male teenagers. Both subjects were cited for disorderly conduct. An officer has been working on an old burglary case. Police have some new leads and DA is close to having us file charges on the subject. An officer was dispatched to Bates St. for a domestic dispute in the late night hours. Upon arrival, police spoke with an adult male and female that had been arguing due to drinking. It never turned physical and the couple was warned to keep the noise under control. Police have been called to Bates St. for parking issues at the school. Officers have been told to keep an eye out for violations that occur after school. Police were called to YHS for a disorderly student. A male teenager became violent inside the principal's office yelling and flipping over furniture. An Indian Camp resident reported she has been receiving phone scams. Caller states that she has a virus on her PC and his company can help clean up her PC. Then the caller wants personal information which she did not give. Officers have been doing house checks every shift on the residents that have left home for the winter months. Police were called to YHS for a student getting into an altercation with a school teacher. The teen was cited for disorderly conduct. Officers were called to College St. for a dog bite victim. An adult male walking his dog was attacked on College St. by a stray German Shepherd. The victim was taken to Warren General Hospital. His dog was taken to a veterinarian for treatment. The stray dog owner was located and charges are pending. Police handled two public drunk calls this month, one male was passed out on Bates St. and one was taken by ambulance from East Main St. to the hospital for his injuries. Police assisted PSP on a mental health call outside the borough. An officer was called to Division St. for a suspicious vehicle in the area. The vehicle was gone upon arrival. **Traffic Violations:** Police issued eleven (11) traffic citations this month for unsafe speed, red lights, expired inspection, registration and suspended drivers.

Training: Officers were sent to refresher training for DUI checkpoints, standard field sobriety (SFST) and Asp Baton.
Chiefs Meetings: New DA has scheduled several chief's meetings with the entire law enforcement community. Topics have been mental health, school incidents and warrants issued.

Warren County Drug Task Force has been newly formed by our board members. The DA and Chiefs have selected the new drug agents for our county. The county team of agents will be very active in our communities. Put down your cell phones and buckle up, Youngsville Police Dept. is currently stopping motorist for hand held cell phone usage in the borough and seat belts. You will receive two (2) tickets if we see the violations occur.

Youngsville Borough Council Regular Meeting – February 10, 2014
These minutes are abbreviated. Complete minutes are available from the borough office.

Mayor Farr called the meeting to order at 4:31 p.m. Erik Leamon gave the invocation. Mayor Farr led the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Farr administered the Oath of Office to re-elected Council Member Pam Olewine. Present: Mayor Farr, Council VP Eric Mineweaser, Council Members: John Pollow, Pam Olewine, Steve Morris, Colette Nelson, Erik Leamon. Also attending were Borough Solicitor Timothy Bevevino, Borough Manager Lisa Hagberg, Borough Secretary Jolean Ishman. Absent was Council Member Troy Clawson and Jr. Council Member Brandon Lake. Minutes: Motion to approve the minutes of the January 13th meeting as printed, made by Mr. Morris, seconded by Mr. Mineweaser, and unanimously carried. Correspondence: Received an Invitation to the McWAPEC dinner in Coudersport on 2/27/14. Chief Mineweaser received a Thank You from PA DUI for his efforts with the DUI Memorial at the Youngsville High School. Solicitor's Report: No Report. Monthly Reports posted for public review at the borough office and distributed to Council prior to the meeting: PD Report, Public Works Report, Fleet Manager's Report, Real Estate Tax Collection Report, January Financial Report, and current/prior months' expenditures. Manager's Report: Erik Leamon reviewed the bills. Recycled 4.34 tons in January. Next recycle day is April 30th. Mayor's Report: No Report. Boards and Commissions: Recreation Commission: Mrs. Nelson stated the sled riding party held on Sunday 2/9/14 went very well. They estimated 200 in attendance. They went through 13 gallons of hot chocolate and 200 hot dogs. 27 sleds entered the cardboard sled race. They were all very impressive and looked like they had great family participation in making them. Thank You to Dollar General and Pete's Beverage for donating snowball makers, shovels, tubes and sleds. Treasurer's Report: BOY cash balance as of January 31st totaled \$1,088,260.75. Streetscape balance from the DCED Grant is \$596. Motion to accept the bills for payment made by Mr. Leamon, seconded by Mrs. Olewine, and unanimously carried by voice vote for the January 2014 bills. Old Business: Streetscape Update - Light Pole Installation: Mr. Mineweaser asked for confirmation that the light pole installation has already been earmarked for payment. Lisa Hagberg confirmed. Mr. Pollow asked a few questions regarding the remaining plans for Streetscape and when the rest will be complete. Lisa Hagberg replied that we are working on it and that there are two grants being applied for. Mayor Farr replied that there are a total of 3 Phases with Streetscape. Railroad Street is Phase 1, East Main Street is Phase 2 and the other side of the bridge is Phase 3. Mr. Leamon asked who is responsible for the "In and Out" direction signs at Tops? Mrs. Hagberg replied that the signs and markings will be repainted in the Spring but they will be irrelevant in the Winter. Settlement with M&B: A settlement has been made with M&B totaling \$5,650.00 and the checks have been mailed out. Executive Session: No Executive Session Adjournment: Motion to adjourn made by Mrs. Olewine and seconded by Mr. Mineweaser. Meeting adjourned at 5:54 p.m.
