December 2013 Police Incidents

Incidents Received: Youngsville Borough Police received several calls from residents on High St., Fifth St. and Coleman Alley about snowmobiles trespassing on private property. An officer did attempt to approach the sleds but could not get them to stop. The president of the county snowmobile club was informed about sleds riding off the designated trails. Police were dispatched to YHS for four false burglar alarms this month. The school district has been cited for multiple false alarm calls. An officer was called to assist another agency for a hit and run that was in the our area. A juvenile at YEMS was cited for making threatening remarks towards a school teacher. A fifteen year old male was taken into custody after he was found to be in possession of marijuana on school property. Police were called to YHS pavilion near Woodard St. for suspicious individuals in the area. During a pat down of the teenagers, drugs were found. Juvenile was later released to a parent. Officer responded to Brown Hill Rd. to assist PSP for a motor vehicle accident (MVA). Police also assisted Youngsville Volunteer Fire Dept. (YVFD) on a structure fire on North Main St. Traffic was detoured to Fiddler Hill. YEMS staff reported a fist fight during school hours between three juvenile males. All three were cited for disorderly conduct. Police are investigating a theft at YEMS. A known juvenile female stole another student's shoes at school. Charges are pending. Police are investigating a juvenile male for harassing other students when he placed his finger through his zipper in his pants and continued after being told to stop. He has been cited for harassment. An eighteen year old male was taken out of YHS by police for a mental health evaluation at Warren General Hospital (WGH) after remarks he was making in the vicinity of other students. Police were dispatched to a MVA on Mill St. An adult female lost control of her pickup truck and crashed into a utility pole at the bottom of Hull Hill and Mill St. The roads were very icy at the time of the crash. The female was taken to WGH by her husband. The vehicle had severe damage. Traffic Arrest: Police filed citations on motorist for speeding, red light violations, no proof of insurance, registration and expired inspection. Also tickets were issued for individuals that failed to respond to parking tickets within the prescribed time.

Youngsville Police Department was again honored by AAA for a Gold Community Safety Award. Departments are selected by AAA for our dedication and success on traffic safety and education with our youth and community.

Frequently Asked Question (FAQ):

How many passengers may a junior driver carry? According to Title 75 of the PA Vehicle Code, Section 1503 C-2.1, a junior driver in his first six months may only carry one additional passenger under 18, **unless** the additional passengers are immediate family members (siblings). This does not apply if the junior driver is accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

Youngsville Borough Council Regular Meeting – December 9, 2013 These minutes are abbreviated. Complete minutes are available from the borough office.

Mayor Farr called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m. Rob Olson gave the invocation. Mayor Farr led the Pledge of Allegiance. Present: Mayor Farr, Council VP Douglas Peterson, Council Members: Steve Morris, Rob Olson, Erik Leamon, Troy Clawson. Also attending were Borough Solicitor Timothy Bevevino, Borough Manager Lisa Hagberg, Borough Secretary Jolean Ishman, and Chief of Police Todd Mineweaser. Absent were Council Members, Eric Mineweaser, Pam Olewine and Jr. Council Member Brandon Lake. Minutes: Motion to approve the minutes of the November 11th meeting as printed, made by Mr. Morris, seconded by Mr. Peterson, and unanimously carried. Correspondence: Received a Thank You card from Leadership Warren. Solicitor's Report: No Report. Monthly Reports posted for public review at the borough office and distributed to Council prior to the meeting: PD Report, Public Works Report, Fleet Manager's Report, Real Estate Tax Collection Report, November Financial Report, and current/prior months' expenditures. Manager's Report: Mayor Farr reviewed the bills. Recycled 1.88 tons in November. Next recycle day is January 29th. No recycling day in December. Mayor's Report: Mayor Farr reminded everyone about the Youngsville Hometown Christmas Parade and encouraged everyone to attend. Boards and Commissions: Recreation Commission: The Annual Sled Riding Party will be held on January 26, 2014 at Pool Hill. This is free to the community. This year there will be a Build Your Own Cardboard Sled Race. Treasurer's Report: BOY cash balance as of November 30, 2013: \$1,025,549.02. Motion to accept the bills for payment made by Mr. Olson, seconded by Mr. Leamon, and unanimously carried by voice vote for the May 2013 bills. Motion to accept the June 2013 bills for payment made by Mr. Morris, seconded by Mr. Olson, and unanimously carried by voice vote. Old Business: Resolution 10-2013 Waiver of Police Pension Contribution: Mr. Olson made a motion to adopt the resolution, seconded by Mr. Morris, All in Favor. Approval of Police Contracts: Mr. Olson made a motion for approval and adoption, seconded by Mr. Morris, All in Favor. Any questions on the Budget Message? Mrs. Hagberg asked Council if there were any suggestions or comments about the budget message. The Mayor commended Lisa on an excellent budget message, Mr. Peterson and Mr. Morris agreed. There were no further questions. Resolution 11-2013 2014 Budget Adoption: Mr. Olson made a motion to adopt the resolution, seconded by Mr. Morris, All in Favor. Auditor: Mr. Clawson and Mrs. Hagberg have chosen BWB as the Borough's new auditor. This will be officially named at the January meeting. Executive Session: Council went to executive session at 5:01 p.m. and returned at 5:06 p.m. Adjournment: Motion to adjourn made by Mr. Morris and seconded by Mr. Olson, Meeting adjourned at 5:07 p.m.
