

2. The Borough Manager is authorized to designate as play highways, whenever he deems that action advisable, and for whatever period of time directed by him, any part of any street in the Borough, where sledding and coasting, shall be permitted. That play highway shall be set apart for the purpose under the direction of the Borough Manager.

3. No person shall drive any motor vehicle upon any play highway at any time when that street shall be designated as a play highway, except in case of emergency, with special permission of the Borough Manager or of the police officer in charge, who shall first clear that play highway of all persons using it for the purpose for which it was set aside. Any person who violates any provision of this subsection shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and costs.

§218. Snowmobile Roads Designated.

1. The Borough Council of the Borough of Youngsville expressly recognizes and finds that regulated and restricted use of snowmobiles can contribute to the public welfare of the Borough's citizens and visitors while enhancing the economy of the Borough.

2. For purposes of this Section, the following definitions shall be applicable:

SNOWMOBILE - an engine-driven vehicle of a type which utilizes sled type runners, or skis, or an endless belt tread or any combination of these or similar means of contact with the surface upon which it is operated. The term does not include any farm tractor, highway or other construction equipment, or any military or law enforcement vehicle.

3. The following routes are designated as snowmobile routes and snowmobiles may share these designated roads with vehicular traffic:

A. Seventh Street from Hilltop Park, East to High Street.

B. South on High Street to Fifth Street.

C. East on Fifth Street to the St. Luke's Roman Catholic Church property.

D. Access on Second Street from Water Street to North Main Street.

E. A map of the Borough with the designated routes duly marked and noted will be kept with the Borough Secretary and is incorporated herein by reference.

4. Regulations.

A. Adequate notices (signs) of such designation and determination shall be sufficiently and prominently displayed. The purchase and posting of said notices (signs) shall be the sole

responsibility of Warren County Recreational Trailblazers.

B. There shall be no liability imposed on the Borough of Youngsville or any other agency as a result of the designation of snowmobile roads.

C. The use of snowmobiles is prohibited between the following hours of 2:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. daily.

D. Snowmobile operation shall be limited to fifteen (15) miles per hour.

E. The owner and operators of snowmobiles are subject to Chapter 77 of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code, known and cited as the "Snowmobile and All-Terrain Vehicle Law," which is incorporated herein by reference.

5. Prohibitions.

A. No person shall operate, nor shall any owner permit any snowmobile to be operated on the streets and sidewalks of the Borough of Youngsville, except as hereinabove provided.

B. No person shall operate nor shall any owner permit a snowmobile to be operated on any private property except when the written permission of the owner of the property has been expressly obtained by such person. Said permission(s) shall be filed with the Borough Secretary.

C. Every owner of a snowmobile who shall knowingly permit any person, minor or adult, to operate such snowmobile in violation of the terms of this Part shall be jointly and severally liable with such person for any damages caused by such person in operating such snowmobile.

6. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Section shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a summary offense and shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) and/or to be committed to the Warren County jail a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both, plus costs of prosecution.
